Making a Book Trailer

You are going to make your own book trailer.

What do you think it should include?



Book title

Some intrigue to make you want to read the book

Name of author

Music that reflects the book's mood

No spoilers!

Give a flavour of the book's genre, mood, themes...

Images - filming, animation, pictures, drawings...


Text - quotes, reviews, captions...





Copyright

- You must follow copyright law when making your trailer. Why?
- This means you can't use any images from the Internet (for example, illustrations of characters or pictures from the film adaptation.
- Draw your own or take your own photos of the book cover etc.





Camerawork

- Mind-mapping:
 - What camera shots, angles and movements do you already know?

- How can the camerawork affect:
 - elements of the film?
 - the audience?

Camerawork Practice

Take an object from the table (or of your own).

Draw six pictures or take six photos of that object using each kind of camerawork.















Planning Your Book Trailer

- 1. Watch different iMovie trailer templates and choose the most suitable one for your book.
- 2. Brainstorm everyone's ideas for the trailer.
- 3. Use the iMovie trailer storyboard template to plan the images and text.
 - Try to use different camera shots and angles.
 - There's no need for your best artwork!
- 4. Decide who will take on which roles. Make sure everyone gets a chance to try any role they want to.
- 5. Gather any costumes, props, artwork and equipment that you need.



Perfect Filming

Make sure the camera is in landscape position.

Make sure strong lighting is behind the camera.

If actors are speaking, make sure they are close to the camera or microphone.

Make sure you have all the shots you need.

Keep experimenting until you're happy.
